What is bullying?

Bullying is when a person is hurtful or unkind to someone else on purpose and usually more than once. Bullying can be done by one person or by a group of people. A useful way to remember bullying is...

Bullying can be...

- **Emotional:** Hurting people's feelings, leaving people out, gossiping.
- **Physical:** Punching, kicking, pushing, damaging their belongings.
- **Verbal:** Name calling, teasing, offensive remarks.
- **Cyber:** Saying unkind things by text, email or social media.
- **Prejudice:** Racial, religious beliefs, gender, sexuality, special educational needs or disability.

Who can I tell if I am being bullied?

If you think you are being bullied, you can tell your teacher or any member of staff.

You could also talk to your parents/carers, friends, a member of the anti-bullying group or any other trusted adult.

What happens next?

Your teachers will talk to you and make a record of the incident. They will offer support to all involved and assess what next steps need to be taken.

What should I do if I see someone else being bullied?

- Don't walk away and ignore the bullying
- Let the bully know that you are going to tell an adult
- Tell the bully to stop if it is safe to do so.
- Don't stay silent or the bullying will carry on.
