As we come to the end of another year, I wanted to take this opportunity to write to you all in person. The year has flown by and it is hard to believe we are back in July and planning for September. It only seems a few days ago I was writing an end of year message last July!

It has been an excellent year in terms of results, once again our Year Six pupils have excelled and our SATS results have continued to reach levels far above national averages. This is particularly noticeable in reading where over half of the Year Six pupils reached a greater depth level. The progress of pupils across the school has also been really pleasing with our Early Years Foundation Stage, Phonics and Year Two data also being very strong. Again, the building block of education, reading, is a particular strength and we thank all of those parents/carers and family members who read regularly with their children as the difference this makes is striking. I would also like to take the opportunity to thank our volunteers who come in each week to hear children read, your efforts have such an impact and are so welcome.

Of course, the academic achievements of the pupils is important but the school is about so much more. We had our SIAMs inspection in May, which looks at the Church School elements of the school and the ethos and values. It was lovely to get such a glowing report and for the inspector to recognise what we see here each day. He reported;

"The school is a place of acceptance and nurture, as a result, pupils are enabled to grow as confident, well-rounded individuals, motivated and keen to learn. They are taught to value success beyond the academic and encouraged to persevere in the face of challenges. They develop a strong sense of responsibility, help others and care for the natural world."

Another thank you should go to all the members of the school's Parent Teacher Association for all their support towards the school and also to Rev. David, Rev. Andy and Mark Palmer for their involvement, not just through worships but through everything they bring to our school community.

I would like to wish all of our Year Six pupils and their families the very best for the future, they have been an outstanding cohort and they will be very much missed by everyone at the school.

Finally, I want to wish everyone in the Brixworth School family and in the wider community the very best summer holiday and to look forward to next year's adventure in September.
